

Regular Monthly Meeting
March 8, 2007

The regular monthly meeting of the Shenango Township Board of Supervisors was held on Thursday, March 8, 2007, 7:00 P.M., at the Shenango Township Municipal Building with Supervisors Larry Herman and Bob Peters present.

The meeting was opened with a salute to the flag.

The minutes were read and approved from the previous meeting.

The Police Report was given by Chief Nocera and Officer Cwynar.

Motion by Mr. Herman second by Mr. Peters to approve payment of the general fund expenses.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Herman to approve payment of the sewer fund expenses.

Motion by Mr. Herman second by Mr. Peters to adopt Ordinance #2 or 2007, Parking Ordinance.

Possible date for Clean Up Day will be May 5th, depending on availability of roll off bins.

Public Comment:

Mr. Ken Cannon, Forest Avenue, asked if the police would monitor the merge point south bound on Rt 65, during early morning and late afternoon.

Mr. Greg Zeddler, asked what the plans were for the development of the area next to ESB Bank. Mr. Peters stated that ESB will use 3 acres for the bank but they have not stated with any certainty as to what they may do.

Mr. Bob Hinton, Spring Hill Lane, asked if anything could be done with the entrances to St. Vitus Cemetery, to correct the storm water and ice problems on the roadway. Mr. Herman stated that they will be contacted again.

Mr. Dale Wehr, Willowbrook Road, asked about the Park Board, an open house for the building, location of township offices and the possibility of a Township Manager. Mr. Herman stated that the Park Board has been meeting monthly. Open House possibly next month but would be announced. The office location should be resolved shortly and that personnel issues cannot be discussed at the public meeting. The possibility of a manager is something that maybe be considered at some point in the future.

Mr. Oran Allen, Savannah Gardner Road, asked about the county liquid fuels monies designated for the Township. Mr. Herman stated that the funds will be used this spring to correct problems on Dean Drive, Aiken Road and Old Butler Road. Mr. Allen also stated that the county had looked into a Business manager and placed it on the ballot to change the form of county government, perhaps the township should look it this.

Mr. Chris Buck, Forest Avenue, asked the status of the bridge project on Old Butler Road. Mr. Herman stated that it is in the hands of the state and scheduled to go out to bid in the late spring or summer. Mr. Buck, also stated that he does not believe that a Township Manager, is a good idea, why pay someone to do what the people elect the Supervisors to do.

Mr. Tim Buck, Service Street, asked if there are any plans to rezone in the township. Mr. Herman stated that there are several areas that are being looked into as possible areas that need to be examined.
