

Regular Monthly Meeting
July 12, 2007

The regular monthly meeting of the Shenango Township Board of Supervisors was held on Thursday, July 12, 2007, 7:00 PM, at the Shenango Township municipal Building with Supervisors Larry Herman, Bob Peters and William Albertini present.

The meeting was opened with a salute to the flag.

The minutes were read and approved from the previous meeting.

Chief Nocera gave the monthly Police Report.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve payment of the general fund expenses.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve payment of the sewer fund expenses.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve the Larry Herman Subdivision, contingent upon satisfaction of reviewed items by the Lawrence County Planning Department.

Public Comment:

Mr. Dale Wehr, Willowbrook Road, would like something done about the dust being created by the traffic for the recycling bins, as well as, the time that the bins are emptied by the carrier. Mr. Herman has contacted the County for any possible solutions.

Mr. Scott Stoner, Willowbrook Road, also asked about a fence being placed around the recycling bins.

Mr. Giannone, 107 Links Drive, asked the status of the developers plan for Shenango Greens. Mr. Herman stated that the plan is being reviewed and recommendations will be made on the development. Mr. Giannone then thanked the Supervisors for their assistance.

Mr. John Hanna Denny Drive, asked if Cochran Hill Road would be rebuilt. Mr. Herman stated that the road will be rebuilt on the entire road to township specifications.

Patricia Chill, Mosser Drive, asked that the supervisors look into that area for campers and other junk. Mr. Herman stated that the matter would be looked into.

Ms. Theresa Presnjar, Big Run Creek Road, property next to her home has been posted and it is not being mowed and would like the township to force this area to be mowed.

Mr Peters stated that the area in question needs to be surveyed, once that is done and an owner of the property can be determined, the owner will be required to cut the grass.

Mr. Manny Weinschenk, Pennsylvania Avenue asked what can be done about habitual offenders to the high grass ordinance. Solicitor Cilli stated that due process must be given even to habitual offenders according to the ordinance.

Mr. Ken Cannon, would like the board to make a motion for the Tax Office to be located at the municipal building. Mr. Herman stated that due to the tax law, the Board of Supervisors cannot dictate the location of the tax office, but would welcome the office to be located at the municipal building.

Mrs. Sandy Snyder, would like volunteers for the community park.

Mr. Peters thanked Mrs. Snyder for her work at the park and Mr. Jim White for his efforts with the beautification committee.
