

Regular Monthly Meeting  
December 14, 2006

The regular monthly meeting of the Shenango Township Board of Supervisors was held on Thursday, December 14, 2006, 7:00 PM at the Shenango Township Municipal Building with Supervisors Larry Herman, Bob Peters and William Albertini present.

The meeting was opened with a salute to the flag.

The minutes were read and approved from the previous meeting.

Officer Domenick gave the police report.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve payment of the general fund expenses.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve payment of the sewer fund expenses.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve the LaFrontera Conservation Fund Subdivision, contingent upon satisfaction of reviewed items by the Lawrence County Planning Department.

Public Comment:

Mr. Dave Dowdel, Aiken Road, stated that the lot near his residence needs to be cut.

Mr. Chris Buck, asked if the tax collector would be moving her office into the municipal building. Mr. Peters stated that he would talk to the school and look into it. Mr. Buck also asked when the bid would be going out for the bridge on Old Butler Road.

Mrs. Jama Suleiman, of Super 8 on New Butler Road asked if something could be done about dogs barking in the area. Mr. Herman, stated that a letter was sent to the dog warden to investigate the complaint.

Mr. Manny Weinschenk, asked if vascar lines could be painted on some roads in the township. Officer Domenick stated that lines would be painted in the near future. Mr. Weinschenk also asked if there was a time frame on the litigation with all of the Morrone properties.

Mr. Oran Allen, Savannah Gardner Road, asked if the traffic signals could be timed to be changed to coordinate with the traffic patterns to accommodate the buses and increased school traffic. Mr. Herman stated that Bruce & Meerilees are looking into the timing and will propose a change to PennDot.

Mr. Allen also wanted to know if the Township is receiving any storage fees for the seized vehicle. Mr. Peters stated at this time he was not aware of any fees, but that it could be part of the case. Mr. Allen also asked about the use of straight salt and antiskid.
