

Regular Monthly Meeting  
July 9, 2009

The regular monthly meeting of the Shenango Township Board of Supervisors was held on Thursday, July 9, 2009 at the Shenango Township Municipal Building with Supervisors Bob Peters and William Albertini present.

The meeting was opened with a salute to the flag.

The minutes were read and approved from the previous meeting.

The police report was read.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve payment of the general fund expenses. Mr. Peters – yes, Mr. Albertini – yes.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to approve payment of the sewer fund expenses. Mr. Peters – yes, Mr. Albertini – yes.

Motion by Mr. Peters second by Mr. Albertini to adopt Ordinance # 1 of 2009, Roadside Sales. Mr. Oran Allen asked if this would prevent people from selling home grown produce in front of their own homes. Mr. Cilli stated that it would not. Mr. Peters – yes, Mr. Albertini – yes.

Public Comment:

June Duda, 1201 Willowbrook Road, would like the ditch cleaned out in front of her home.

Mr. Many Weinschenk, Pennsylvania Avenue, asked if something could be done about bird droppings at the plaza. Mr. Peters stated that the owners of the plaza have been notified.

Mr. Bill Alexander, Savannah Gardner Road, stated that there is a dip in the road near Circle Drive on Old Pittsburgh Road, and bad patch on Gardner Center. Mr. Albertini stated that those areas would be addressed with this years resurfacing project.

Mr. Andy Klatka, Old Butler Road, asked if rezoning could take place on some property along Old Bulter Road. Solicitor Cilli stated that approximately every ten years zoning is reviewed with a consultant and changes are considered.

Mr. Brian Watkins, Cornell Avenue, asked questions in regard to building a garage without a principle dwelling. Solicitor Cilli, recommended a reverse sub division and that he should contact his legal counsel on how to proceed.

Mr. Richard Zornes, asked about squatters rights, Solicitor Cilli stated that he was referred to adverse passion and he should establish if permission was given or obtained and consult an attorney.

Mr. Sam Garver, Dean Drive, asked why more than one police officer is needed on traffic stops. Officer Domenick, stated that it takes two officers to effectively use the Nrad system and that the use of the system was done through the Smooth Operator Program which pays for the officers time worked.
