REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING

The regular monthly of the Shenango Township Board of Supervisors was held November 13, 1986 at 7:00 p.m. at the Municipal Building with Supervisors Joe Shinsky, Andy Piccuta and Earl Cunningham present.

The meeting was opened with a salute to the flag.

The minutes were read and approved from the October 9, 1986 meeting with the following correction: the ½ reimbursement from Penn Dot was for the relocation of the fire hydrant on 422.

Motion by A. Piccuta, second by E. Cunningham to pay the general fund bills. Motion carried.

Motion by E. Cunningham, second by A. Piccuta to pay the sewer fund bills. Motion carried.

Motion by A. Piccuta, second by J. Shinsky to pay the revenue sharing bills. Motion carried.

Motion by E. Cunningham, second by A. Piccuta to adopt resolution to change bonding companies for Tax Collector, Carol M. Reed. Motion carried.

Chief David B. Rishel gave the police report.

Joe Shinsky announced the upcoming hearing for Dangerous Buildings located in the township.

It was announced that the budget will be ready for view by December 8, 1986.

Money was received from Penn Dot for the snow removal agreement Shenango Township holds with Penn Dot.

Motion by E. Cunningham, second by A. Piccuta to adopt resolution for signature authorization. This will allow J. Shinsky, Chairman to sign agreement with Penn Dot for ½ Reimbursement for the Bridge posting located on Old Butler Road.

Motion by E. Cunningham second by A. Piccuta to adopt resolution for tax exoneration from Tax Claim Bureau. Motion carried.

Motion by E. Cunningham, second by A. Piccuta to pay real estate and per capita tax refunds as presented by Carol M. Reed, Tax Collector. Motion carried.

E. Cunningham made a suggestion to send Penn Dot a

letter to request the removal of the no left turn signs at the intersection of Willowbrook Road and U.S. 422, and also the removal of a minimum of 200 feet of the concrete barrier.
